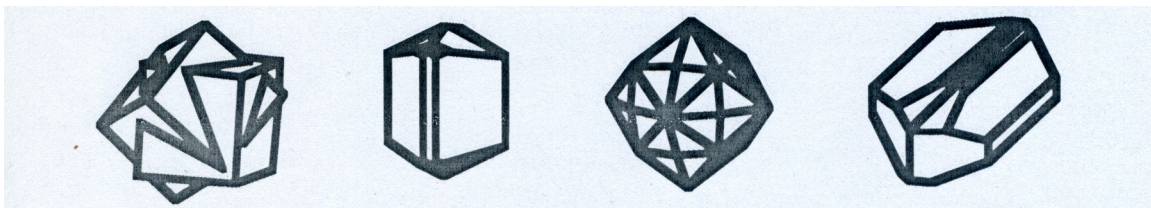

VP NOTES...Inga

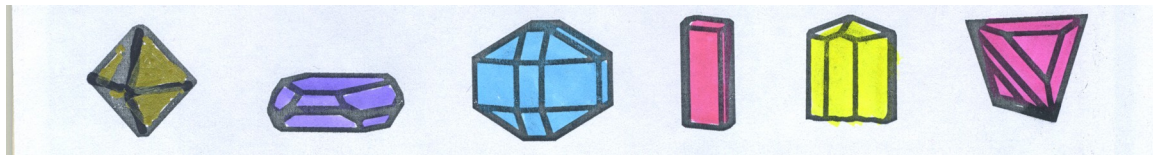
Dr. Jennifer Peteya has rescheduled her talk for January. If it turns out to be a bad winter weather day, it will be in May.

Sunshine Report: Sunshine Chair, JoAnn McGuire gave report on recovering members.

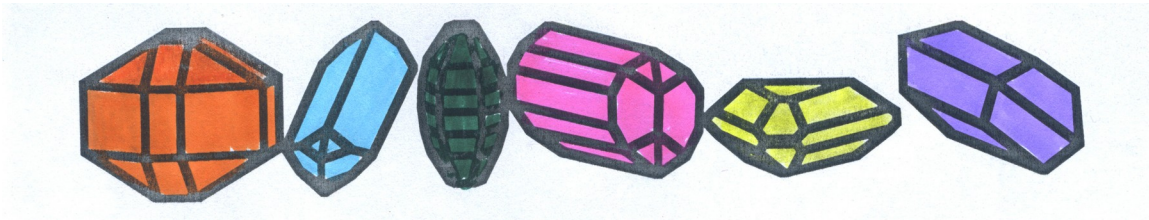
Membership Report: Nothing new to report.
